DAY 1 | TUESDAY, APRIL 7TH

Spiritual Stewardship

Theme: Understanding Our Spiritual Gifts

Definition: Stewardship in a spiritual context involves recognizing and utilizing the gifts God has given us for His glory and the benefit of others.

Scripture Focus:

Luke 16:10 (NIV): "Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much, and whoever is dishonest with very little will also be dishonest with much."

1 Peter 4:10: "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms."

Prayer Points:

- 1. Ask God to reveal the spiritual gifts He has entrusted to you.**
- 2. Pray for wisdom to use your gifts to serve your church and community.**
- 3. Seek forgiveness for any times you have been unfaithful in your stewardship.**

Reflection:

Spend time in silence, meditating on God's Word as instructed in Psalm 1. Reflect on how you can be a better steward of the spiritual gifts God has entrusted to you. Consider how to actively utilize these gifts for service, and write down your thoughts and commitments.

Conclusion of Day 1:

As you complete this day of consecration, reflect on your journey. Consider journaling your insights and commitments regarding your spiritual stewardship. Pray for continued guidance as you seek to be trustworthy in the gifts God has given you.



DAY 2 | WEDNESDAY, APRIL 8TH

Physical Well-being and Health Stewardship

Theme: Honoring God with Our Bodies

Definition: Stewardship of health emphasizes the importance of taking care of our physical bodies as a temple of the Holy Spirit.

Scripture Focus:

- 1 Corinthians 6:19-20: "Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your bodies."
- Luke 12:48: "From everyone who has been given much, much will be demanded; and from the one who has been entrusted with much, much more will be asked."

Prayer Points:

1. Thank God for the gift of life and your physical health.
2. Ask for strength and discipline to care for your body through diet, exercise, and rest.
3. Pray for healing for those in your community suffering from health issues.

Reflection:

Take time for deep reflection on how you have handled your health and well-being. Consider your self-care practices: How do you prioritize your physical health in your daily life? How are you caring for your body as a temple of the Holy Spirit? Reflect on how you can incorporate self-care not only for yourself but also how you can encourage those around you to do the same. Write down specific actions and commitments you can take to honor God through your physical health and promote well-being in your community.

Conclusion of Day 2

As you complete this day of consecration, reflect on your journey. Consider journaling your insights and commitments regarding your health stewardship, and pray for continued strength and guidance as you strive to honor God with your body.



DAY 3 | THURSDAY, APRIL 9TH

Stewardship of Resources and Relationships

Theme: Managing Resources and Cultivating Relationships

Definition: Stewardship involves managing not only our finances and material possessions but also recognizing relationships as precious gifts from God that require love, care, and fellowship.

Scripture Focus:

- Luke 16:10 (NIV): "Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much..."
- Proverbs 21:20: "The wise store up choice food and olive oil, but fools gulp theirs down."
- 1 John 4:19: "We love because He first loved us."
- Luke 12:48: "From everyone who has been given much, much will be demanded; and from the one who has been entrusted with much, much more will be asked."

Prayer Points:

1. Thank God for the relationships in your life—family, friends, mentors, and community.
2. Pray for wisdom in nurturing these relationships, recognizing them as gifts that require intentionality and love.
3. Seek forgiveness for any neglect or harm done to these relationships and commit to fostering love and fellowship moving forward.
4. Ask God for guidance on how to manage your financial resources wisely, ensuring they reflect His provision and generosity.
5. Pray for a generous heart that seeks to share and bless others.

Reflection:

Consider how you can be a better steward of both your resources and the relationships God has blessed you with. Think about specific actions you can take to deepen your connections with others, whether through acts of kindness, quality time, or words of affirmation, while also evaluating how to wisely manage your finances. Write down your thoughts and commitments.

Conclusion of Day 3:

As you complete this 3-day consecration, take time to reflect deeply on your journey and the stewardship of resources and relationships in your life. Consider journaling your insights and commitments as a means of solidifying your dedication to being a faithful steward.

Reflect on Philippians 2:12: "Therefore, my dear friends, as you have always obeyed—not only in my presence, but now much more in my absence—continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling," and 2 Peter 1:5-7: "For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; and to godliness, mutual affection; and to mutual affection, love."

These scriptures remind us of the importance of actively working on our faith walk and being intentional in our stewardship. Pray for continued guidance and strength as you seek to embody the trustworthiness that God desires in all that He has given you. Reflect on Hebrews 12:1-2: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith."

May this consecration lead you to a deeper commitment to caring for your soul, relationships, and resources, as you strive to honor God in every area of your life.
